- *The Jeevika unit of Kerala and MAIN (Migrant Assistance & Information Network) in collaboration with the Indian Social Institute, New Delhi distributed 100 Dry ration kits along with medicines to the families of interstate migrants at Ernakulam district, Kerala. The beneficiaries were those people who lost their job and their loved ones during this pandemic. The distribution was done by the community leaders and volunteers, approximately 500 people benefitted from the dry ration kits.*
- *The Kit distribution was done at various places such as Kalady, Perumbavoor, Kothamangalam, and Angamaly, etc. All the migrants were from West Bengal, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh & Odisha.*
- *Some of the families in these places have lost their only breadwinner and now that the family's conditions are at the worst moment, our community volunteers identified these people and accompanied them to face the reality. They were supported with dry ration kits & medicines, the kit had all essential household items such as Atta, rice, masalas, Oil and onion etc. that would last for one month.*
- *The community volunteers of Jeevika unit gave them awareness and provided them with necessary medicines such as vitamin-c tablets, paracetamols, masks, and sanitizers. All the distribution was conducted at various particular areas with the proper following of social distancing and covid-19 protocols.*
